

Paolo Piccari teaches *Theoretical Philosophy* and *Moral Philosophy*. In March 2017, he obtained the Italian National Scientific Qualification for the position of Full Professor in Theoretical Philosophy (M-FIL/01).

At the University of Siena, he is Scientific Director of the *UNISI Ethos Observatory for Sustainability*, a member of the Teaching Committee for the Master's degree programme in *History and Philosophy*, and the DISPOC delegate for the Humanities Library.

He has chaired teacher training programmes for the teaching subject categories *Philosophy and Human Sciences* and *Philosophy and History*. He has served on the University's Quality Assurance Board and on the committee responsible for revising its Code of Ethics. He was Director of the university training course in *Sustainability, Development and Responsible Consumption* and the DSFUCI delegate for relations with local institutions and businesses and for continuing education. He also coordinated the subject areas of the Master's programme in *Business Ethics, Consumer Ethics and Social Responsibility* for eight editions.

He has been a visiting scholar at the University of Oxford and the Faculty of Theology of Lugano. At the Arezzo campus, he has promoted and organised international conferences and study days, including *The Structure and Ontological Levels of Reality* (26–27 November 2012), *The Epistemology of Ordinary Knowledge* (7–9 October 2013), *Why Does What Exists Exist? Between Physics and Metaphysics* (14–16 December 2016), and *Nothingness and the Problem of Grounding* (19–20 November 2019).

A member of the Italian Society for Theoretical Philosophy (SIFiT), he is co-editor of the philosophy journal *Arkete*.

He is a member of the Scientific Committee of the Ethos Observatory at Luiss Business School, the Board of Directors of the Italian National Consumers Union, and the General Council of the ANIA–Consumers Forum, of which he was formerly Vice-President. He has previously served on the National Council of Users at the Italian Communications Authority (AGCOM) and the National Council of Consumers and Users at the Italian Ministry of Economic Development (MISE).

A member of the Italian Order of Journalists since 1992, he has contributed to several newspapers, including *la Repubblica*, and has appeared as an expert on numerous television programmes, particularly *Unomattina* (Rai 1).
