Riccardo Pavoni is Full Professor of International and European Law in the Department of Law (*Dipartimento di Giurisprudenza*) of the University of Siena, where he is currently academic coordinator of the EU-funded Jean Monnet Module on European and International Environmental Law (2020-2023).

Starting in 2022, he serves as General Editor of the *Italian Yearbook of International Law*. He is also a member of the Editorial Board of the *Oxford Reports on International Law in Domestic Courts*. He serves as co-director of the Tulane-Siena Institute for International Law, Cultural Heritage and the Arts. He has been a visiting professor at Universidad Autónoma de Bucaramanga (2013; 2019), Tulane University School of Law (2010), Charles University in Prague (2008; 2010; 2015) and the University of Amsterdam (2006).

He is a member of the *European Society of International Law* (ESIL) and the *Società Italiana di Diritto Internazionale e di Diritto dell'Unione Europea* (SIDI).
